10-Oct-2023 - THEMATIC ANALYSIS - CREW SECURITY: Bogota Airport: Criminals pose as police officers to rob travellers

Ground: Colombia : Aviation security

According to a post from Bogota's Security Secretariat on 28 September, Bogota Metropolitan Police (MEBOG) officials arrested a man and woman along Avenida Calle 26 - near the city's El Dorado International Airport (SKBO/BGOG) - for posing as police officers to rob travellers - both Colombian and foreign nationals - outside the facility. Additional media reporting stated that they are accused of committing at least four robberies, including a failed attempt on 9-10 September, which was captured by CCTV cameras. Of note, media reporting stated that the criminals primarily targeted individuals as they hurried transportation via mobile applications, approaching them to claim that they had committed a crime. Further reports suggest that the couple would follow their victims from the exit of the air bridge before approaching them in their vehicle, displaying fake police identification. They would tell them that they were looking for suspects who had just committed a robbery before robbing them of their personal belongings. The criminals used a vehicle with mismatched front and rear licence plates to evade police detection at checkpoints. Upon arresting the couple, the police found a firearm which they reportedly used to intimidate their victims. Prior to identifying the suspects, the Bogota Police had received at least four complaints from individuals who suffered similar crimes. Ensure crews with flights scheduled at airports in Colombia are aware of the latest aviation security situation.
