How To

Running Country Reports

- 1. Click on Reports
- 2. World Map will appear
- Type the Country in the search bar, a list will appear on the right-hand side or click on the area of the interactive map
- 4. A modal will appear with your Standard Report Template
- 5. Click Report
- 6. PDF report will open in new browser window.


Running Airspace Reports

- 1. Click on Reports
- 2. World Map will appear
- 3. Type the Airspace in the search bar, a list will appear on the right-hand side or click on the area of the interactive map
- 4. Click on Airspace of choice
- 5. A modal will appear with your Standard Report Template's
- 6. Click on Report button (Top)
- 7. PDF report will open in a new browser window.

Running Airport Reports

- 1. Click on reports
- 2. Type the airport in the search bar, a list will appear
- 3. Choose your Airport (Either by name or ICAO/ IATA code in the search bar)
- 4. Once the modal appears choose your template (**Standard or Standard + Operational Report**)
- 5. Click Report
- 6. PDF report will open in a new tab.

<u>Standard +Operation report</u>: The reports will now provide you with a combination of security risk advice and operational information in one place to make this process more efficient.




Creating a Template

1. Click on Reports > Templates

- 1) Click Add
- 2) Pick a name to call it.
- 3) Choose your area of focus on the drop-down menu.
- 4) If you want to default this, you can tick the box
- 5) Select by ticking the box of the report element you want to include.

2. Click save
